**DESCRIPTION**

This year's event will focus on aggression and violence in children and adolescents. The day long program highlights presentations by a variety of child and adolescent mental health care specialists, including MDs, a PhD, Social Worker and Counselor. Each presentation will include a 10 minute Q & A session.

**TARGET AUDIENCE** This symposium is designed to meet the educational needs of physicians (psychiatrists, pediatricians, neurologists, family and general practitioners), nurse practitioners, nurses, psychologists, social workers, counselors and school personnel who care for children and adolescents.

**EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES** In the goal to ultimately improve patient care, attendees will be able to:

- Evaluate the neuroscience, taxonomy and psychopharmacology for treating maladaptive aggression
- Discuss diagnostic and treatment considerations, associated with anxiety and depression
- Analyze the impact of bullying and school violence
- Review behaviors, risk factors and possible treatment strategies for young murderers
- Identify effective intervention strategies for various age groups
- Recognize consequences of exposure to violence

**NEEDS ASSESSMENT** This year's topics were chosen in response to recent multiple incidents of school violence, suggestions from past course participants, faculty perception of significant issues in treatments, environmental factors, and review of current trends in literature regarding clinical decision-making and patient care.

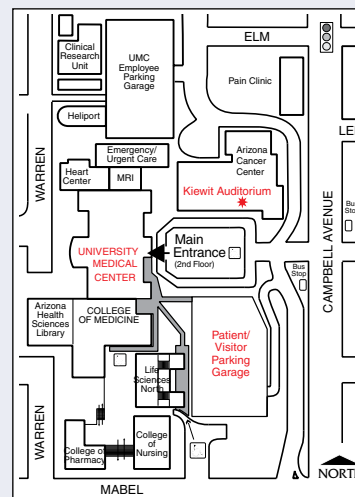
