DESCRIPTION

This year's event will focus on ADHD in children and adolescents. The day long program highlights presentations by a variety of child and adolescent mental health care specialists. Each presentation will include a 10 minute Q & A session.

TARGET AUDIENCE This symposium is designed to meet the educational needs of physicians (psychiatrists, pediatricians, neurologists, family and general practitioners), nurse practitioners, nurses, psychologists, social workers, counselors and school personnel who care for children and adolescents.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES In the goal to ultimately improve patient care in ADHD, attendees will be able to:

- Examine recent advances
- Evaluate implications of cognitive theories and neural mechanisms
- Identify manifestation and diagnostic criteria
- Recognize co-morbidity and related problems
- Describe psychosocial and school interventions
- Review evidence-based pharmacological interventions for children and adults

NEEDS ASSESSMENT This year's topics were chosen in response to recent advances in ADHD, suggestions from past course participants, faculty perception of significant issues in treatments, environmental factors, and review of current trends in literature regarding clinical decision-making and patient care.

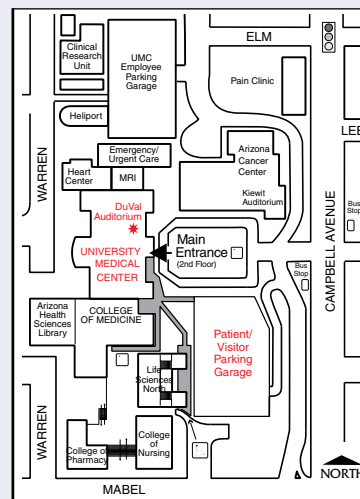
